LIDORAN FACADE SYSTEMS COMPLETE KAMBALA GIRLS SCHOOL PROJECT

LIDORAN FACADE SYSTEMS and **LIDORAN ARCHITECTURAL ROOFING** – members of the Lidoran Group, in conjunction with Brisland Constructions have recently completed a project at Kambala Girls School in Vaucluse. The project combined new metal roofing construction and exterior cladding to a newly constructed section of the school. With the school located in Vaucluse and having a spectacular view of Sydney harbour, we realized this building would have to really compliment the aesthetics of the area.

The cladding material used was Vitrabond aluminium composite panel, chosen for its modern streamline look, in an “off white” colour. To make things a little interesting the architect wanted the panels reduced in size and installed in a brick like formation. This meant a lot more work, but as the pictures show, the final product truly beautified the building.



After the panels were installed the next process was to seal all the joints. Initially the colour white had been specified for the polyurethane, but after doing a small test area we ascertained that this would not be suitable. Several colours were considered and tested, resulting in all parties deciding on black.

The other part of the project was to supply and install new metal Trimdek roofing to the new building. It makes sense tying the two together, as there were many places the two products intertwined. Having just the one contractor meant no confusions; the buck stopped with us and we gladly took responsibility!



All in all, the entire project was a success – a great testimony of hard work, diligence and co-operation with the builder resulting in a fabulous look.

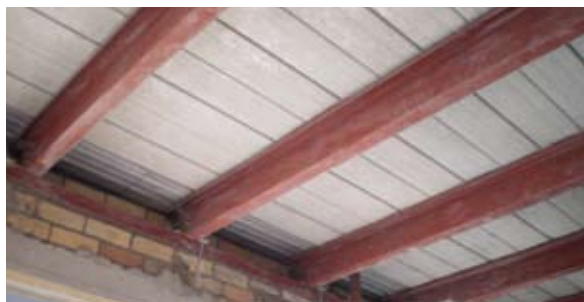
